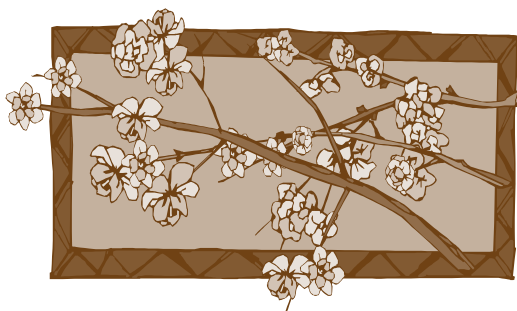


Agency Mission

Accessing Services

- Call Van Buren CMH at (657-5574 or 637-5297) to learn more about starting services.
- Come in person to the Human Services Building at 801 Hazen Street, Paw Paw to begin services.
- Customers are assessed through our Access System in Paw Paw to participate in CMH services.
- After determining eligibility for services, customers receive an assessment, an emergency therapy session, or a referral to services outside CMH as appropriate.
- People with disabilities, or limited English proficiency, may ask for auxiliary aids and services.

The Access System operates on a walk-in basis. The hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Assessments usually take 1½ to 2 hours to finish. Customers are asked to come between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Customers may need to come back another day if they walk-in near 5:00 p.m.

Customers are actively involved in their assessment and treatment plan. Individual needs are decided using the Person-Centered planning process.

Adult and Family Services Division

This division serves adults with mental illness and children with emotional disturbance. Based on individual need and preference, a wide array of services are available to promote recovery, improve coping skills, maintain stability and enjoy meaningful participation in the community.
