The Youth Intervention Screening is available to youth ages 4 to 18 years old, residing or attending school in Van Buren County.

The Youth Intervention Screener, a Master's level clinician, will assist youth/ caregiver(s) in completing age appropriate screening tools during a face-to-face appointment. Results of the screening will be shared with the youth/ caregiver(s).

The Youth Intervention Screener will then help link the family with the appropriate services and provide follow up contacts.

Families are welcome to self refer.
