Every call is private and confidential—and it's the first step in helping us understand your needs, concerns, and the personalized support you're looking for.

Access Team

The Access Team is available Monday through Friday, 8:00am-5:00pm. The Access Team assists with requesting support, checking eligibility, completing assessments, providing crisis intervention, and making referrals.

No one will be denied access to services due to inability to pay; and there is a discounted/sliding fee schedule based on family size and income.



What To Expect

Your first call or walk-in is the first step. We will schedule an intake appointment and take time to get to know you, your needs, and your goals. Then we will work with you to create a care plan and connect you to the services and supports that are right for you. **Intake appointments may take 1½ to 2 hours to finish.*

Everyone is welcome here. Insurance or no insurance, care is available for all ages.

From there, you will begin care with a team that is dedicated to supporting your behavioral health and overall wellness.
