Basic Responsibilities:

Provides immediate support to individuals experiencing mental health crises and emotional distress. Conducts assessments, de-escalates crisis situations, and provides appropriate interventions to ensure the safety and well-being of customers. Develops initial services plans, presents treatment recommendations and links customers to appropriate services. Provides crisis services to individuals wherever they are; including home, work or anywhere else in the community where the individual is experiencing a crisis. Provides backup to Access clinicians when crisis work is not available. Provides after-hours on-call on a rotational basis for additional compensation.

Summary of Required Qualifications:

- Master's degree in social work, psychology, or counseling with appropriate state licensure.
- Demonstrated diagnostic and case reporting skills and ability to provide effective crisis stabilization services to youth and adults.
- Ability to maintain all trainings, certifications and regulatory obligations as required for Crisis Providers.
- Experience in community-based mental health services, including crisis intervention and response, preferred.

Summary of Essential Job Functions:

- Assesses the needs/wishes of individuals/families through a person/family-centered process.
- Provides direct clinical services, including crisis intervention, de-escalation, safety-planning, post-crisis stabilization service, assessment, and service planning.
- Provides crisis services as assigned to other community agencies.
- Facilitates the coordination of services to meet individual needs, links customers to community resources, coordinates with primary care and advocates for the least restrictive environment.
- Provides intake, psychosocial assessment, and crisis response services.
- Coordinates services of the crisis team with police, schools, community agencies, etc. to identify and obtain resources and services in a psychiatric crisis.
- Provides coordination and follow-up for customers after crisis resolution.
- Assists individuals/families in developing natural supports to increase success in the community.
- Intervenes with individuals, families, or groups in coordination with the service/treatment plan to enhance or restore the capacity for emotional/social functioning in the home/school/community.
- Provides after-hours on-call coverage on a rotating basis.
